

Estes Park Gun and Archery Club
May 27th, 2015 – Special Board Meeting
Estes Park Library, 335 E. Elkhorn Avenue

Sharyn Gartner, President, called this special meeting to order at 1000am, with the following Board Members present: Bill Conger, Sharyn Gartner, Steve Murphree, Rick Tekulve and Bill Howell.

With the recent negative actions by the Estes Valley Recreation and Park District with regards to Common Point Outdoor Range and the contract with the EPGAC, Sharyn provided an overview at the most recent meeting in which she was advised that according to the EVRPD, the National Park Service had requested that EVRPD manage the Common Points Range. With that said Sharyn provide an outline as to actions the EPGAC Board conduct in the removal of property and other matters regarding the Common Points Outdoor Range.

That outline included but was not limited to the following; 1. Find Storage including the pursuit of land purchase, rental storage unit(s), and use of member volunteer use of land. 2. Outdoor and Indoor Range Clean-Up days, including using clean-up days for road access with ATV's, call on members for use of equipment, and when the Common Points road is accessible, the use of pack horses, ATV and hum carry out to remove club property. 3. Removal of storage sheds, dismantling and rebuilding on other site(s), burn them or sell sheds. 4. Sell items stored in our storage sheds. 5. Removal of property, Archery targets, Trap curtains, Trap poles, Picnic tables (selective), Plywood and 4x4 posts, All signs purchased by club, Trap generator, trap scoring bench, removal of propane from 500 gal tank, and any other property belonging to the club. 6. Informing and actions by club attorney. 7. Related matters to the Indoor Range. 8. Update newsletter to members and input.

During the continued discussion by the Board is was decided that prior to the removal of club property, a letter be sent to the EVRPD demanding in writing our contractual status, present and future with the EVRPD. Upon receipt of this letter from the EVPRD, membership be advised. The Board also discussed taking this matter to the Town Trustees and the Public.

During the course of these actions the Board will search out the area for land(s) that can be used as a substitute for the Common Point Outdoor Range and or storage.

The Board will also decide a future date for a Special Clean-up Day where membership can be advised of the full circumstances regarding the Common Points Outdoor Range.
